prepared and in line with the organisation's values and mission before they take on their roles. This approach focuses on the importance of extensive training and evaluation process.

6. Including buffers:

Each dabbawalla has the capacity to handle upto 20 deliveries in one day, therefore the system is designed in such a way that it provides maximum support and helps them with flexibility. If for any reason a dabbawalla is not available, the other's in the group take over in order to ensure that the meals are delivered on schedule. Even when they are faced with challenges, this system of adaptability and mutual support make sure that the service remains dependable and effective.

The lesson here is to build in buffers as well as support mechanisms in order to maintain performance under varied conditions , instead of creating systems that are super rigid.

7. A robust support system:

The Dabbawalla's function which leans more towards the idea of mutual assistance rather than competition. There are no official titles or designations within the organisation, everyone is treated fairly and as an equal. Everyone is encouraged to work in teams and this approach ensures that everyone collaborates to achieve the same goal.

8. The Organisational Framework:
