The lids of the dabbas are labelled with numbers, letters, and symbols indicating where they came and where they should be delivered. The Mumbai Dabbawalas are famous for their punctuality. Their mission statement since the day they started operation has been "Always deliver on time."

For over a century, these Dabbawalas have been providing a unique service, collecting home cooked meals from households and delivering them to office workers across the city.
